### 2025 Annual Town Meeting Starts April 1 (no joke!)



Wellesley's Annual Town Meeting begins on Tuesday, April 1, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. in the auditorium of **Wellesley Middle School** (50 Kingsbury Street). The public is invited to attend. Town Meeting is the legislative body for the Town of Wellesley, with 240 elected members representing 8 precincts, who vote on overall Town operations.

2025 Annual Town Meeting members will consider 37 Articles on the [Town Meeting Warrant](#) which include:

- Reviewing and approving operating budgets
- Funding proposed special capital projects
- Authorizing changes to Town operations
- Adopting new and revised Town bylaws
- Adopting new and revised Zoning bylaws
- Other business coming before the Town

Each year before Town Meeting, the Select Board and the Advisory Committee work with Town staff to prepare detailed documents about the issues to be considered. These include the [2025 Budget Book & Town Wide Financial Plan](#) and the [2025 Annual Town Meeting Advisory Report](#).

The complete Town Meeting schedule is below:

- Week 1: Tuesday, April 1 & Wednesday, April 2 @ 7:00 p.m.
- Week 2: Monday, April 7 & Tuesday, April 8 @ 7:00 p.m.
- Week 3: Monday, April 14 & Tuesday, April 15 @ 7:00 p.m.
- Week 4 (if needed): Monday, April 28 & Tuesday, April 29 @ 7:00 p.m.

The Select Board is the five-member elected board that serves as Wellesley's executive branch of government and collaborates closely with all other Town boards and committees. The Select Board meets regularly; [agendas](#) are posted in advance on the Town website; the proceedings are livestreamed on [Wellesley Public Media](#). ### Building Permit Fees Increase on April 1

Beginning April 1, 2025 fees for all permits issued by the Building Department will increase. This modification applies to Building, Electrical, Plumbing and Gas, and Sheet Metal permits. These changes update the fee schedule to reflect current costs associated with construction, permit processing, inspections, peer communities, and enforcement. Fees for commercial building permits will not change at this time.
