Memorial Day Ceremony

Wellesley's annual Memorial Day ceremony took place on Friday, May 30 at dusk with a solemn community event to honor and remember those who gave their lives for our Country. Town officials, Veterans, and citizens first gathered at Woodlawn Cemetery to place a memorial wreath and recognize departed Veterans, and then moved to the Wellesley War Memorial in front of Town Hall for a longer ceremony.



With a solo bagpiper, music provided by the Wellesley High School band, and colors presented by the Wellesley Police and Fire Department honor guards, the program featured Memorial Day readings, the presentation of Governor Healey's Memorial Day proclamation, and a moving Memorial Day reflection from resident and Marine Corps Veteran Todd Bowers.

The ceremony included the presentation of the POW/MIA flag, a reading of the names of all residents who died in service, a salute to the dead from the Wellesley Police Department, and echo Taps performed by two high school trumpeters. Thank you to all who attended.

Review & Comment on the Strategic Housing Plan

A [draft of Wellesley's Strategic Housing Plan](#) is now available and will be presented on **Tuesday, June 3 at 6 p.m.** at a joint meeting of the Select Board and the Planning Board in the Juliani Room at Town Hall. The public is invited to review the plan and share comments in-person on June 3 or by emailing housingplan@wellesleyma.gov

The Strategic Housing Plan is intended to help Wellesley plan for its future housing needs proactively, identify our community's vision for housing and its short- and long-term objectives, and offer strategies for implementing these objectives. It was prepared by the Town consultant Barrett Planning Group.

The draft plan includes six goals and 48 strategies to address housing in Wellesley, along with a proposed implementation timeline.

Equity Audit Update

The Town's DEI Equity Audit wrapped up earlier this spring with a presentation to the Select Board from consultant Racial Equity Group. The equity audit was proposed by the DEI Task Force with funding approved at 2023 Annual Town Meeting. It was conducted in two phases in 2024, and assessed a variety of equity aspects – race, ethnicity, gender, national origin, color, disability, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, religion, socioeconomic status, or other socio-culturally significant factors. The findings were summarized in a report that includes a best practices gap and barrier analysis and recommends strategic actions for the Town to help address the overall equity audit findings. There are plans to hold a facilitated dialogue with the community in Fall 2025 to discuss the findings of the equity audit and the steps our community, our businesses, and Town government may take to move forward in this work.
