Select Board Updates: 2025 Fall Town Meeting starts November 3

The Select Board will convene a [Town Meeting](#) this fall, beginning on Monday, November 3, at 7:00 p.m. in the Wellesley High School auditorium. Residents are welcome to attend Town Meeting and speak on issues. Information about the Warrant and deadlines to submit articles for Town Meeting consideration will be posted on the Town website later this month.



The process for setting the FY2027 Town and School budgets starts this month. Stay informed on the budget process by attending Select Board and Advisory Committee meetings. The Select Board meets on Tuesday nights, and the Advisory Committee meets on Wednesday nights. Agendas and materials are posted on the [Meeting Calendar](#). Good News! Tax Relief Program Improvements

Veterans and senior citizens can now benefit from improvements to Wellesley tax relief programs. 2025 Annual Town Meeting accepted the provisions of the [HERO Act](#), increasing certain Veterans exemptions. Read [the Veterans exemptions guide](#). Veterans with 100% disability are also eligible for a motor vehicle excise tax exemption. Currently, the Senior Deferral Program is waiting final State Legislature approval which could increase the income limit on gross receipts.

Explore [tax relief program information](#) on the Assessor's Office webpages to determine if you're eligible. *If you already receive real estate tax exemption benefits, FY26 applications will be mailed to you in August.* Tax relief applications are due annually by April 1.

Weston Road Construction Update

Work on the [Weston Road Reconstruction Project](#) this month is focused on stormwater as crews install new catch basins from Beechwood Road to Pine Plain Road. Granite curbing will be installed in early September. The street remains closed on weekdays from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. to all traffic except for those who live along Weston Road and dead-end side streets.

Please support Weston Road businesses! Fells Market, Andrew's Pharmacy, Weston Road Cafe, and other retailers are open and accessible even though the road is closed. Detail officers are directing traffic so shoppers can get to these businesses.

Street Smarts! Understanding Capeseal

Summer is prime street resurfacing time. Lately, DPW has received questions about Capeseal so here's the scoop (hint: it has nothing to do with Cape Cod). Capeseal is a proven road resurfacing treatment that's a durable, cost effective alternative to hot-mix asphalt paving. It's done in two parts: in the first phase, a chip seal layer is applied, which consists of liquid asphalt followed by aggregate (stone chips). This may appear rough & gravelly, which is normal. In the second phase, a smooth, finish coat is applied over the chip seal to create a road surface that provides excellent traction and durability. This second surface needs 2-3 weeks to properly cure; during this time the roadway may be swept 1-2 times to remove loose aggregate.

Health Department - "Skip the Stuff" and Reduce Waste

The next time you order take out or food delivery, plan to "skip the stuff." This new Board of Health bylaw, approved at 2025 Annual Town Meeting, goes into effect in January 2026 and requires all food service establishments to provide single-use articles such as plastic utensils and single-serving condiment packages *ONLY upon customer request or at a self-service counter.* You'll be hearing more about this in the months to come, but start developing good habits now.

Single-use foodware in landfills and incinerators is a growing problem that results in 4.9 million tons of waste every year. This bylaw aims to: 1) reduce the amount of waste generated by single-use articles, 2) change customer habits, and 3) help reduce unnecessary costs to food service establishments. Beginning in January, customers will need to ask for single-use items (forks, spoons, napkins, etc.) in all food establishments and will need to check a box to request them when ordering online. Planning Department - RIO Task Force Update

The recently created Residential Incentive Overlay (RIO) Task Force has met three times since its inception this spring. The Task Force is made up of 16 community volunteers who are reviewing the [Wellesley RIO Bylaw](#) to identify areas for improvement and clarification and consider solutions to address those areas. Youth Commission - Fill a Back-to-School Backpack
