Interested candidates can pick up papers now through January 9, 2026 if you're running for a town-wide office, or until January 23, 2026 if you're running for a Town Meeting member seat. Nomination papers are available in the Town Clerk's Office at Town Hall during business hours, Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Select Board Update

MassBay Status

On November 26, the Select Board announced it was postponing the visioning workshop for the [MassBay land disposition proposal](#) at 40 Oakland Street. This decision was due to concerns by the Board that representatives of the Commonwealth have given conflicting information about their intentions and the role the Town and our residents can play in influencing the project at MassBay. The Board wants to make sure the visioning is conducted under shared assumptions so that all input will be considered and constructive.



Annual Town Meeting Begins March 30, 2026

The Warrant for [2026 Annual Town Meeting](#) is open and will close on Wednesday, December 23 at 4 p.m. Motions for any articles to be considered at Town Meeting are due in the Select Board Office by Friday, February 6, 2026 at 4 p.m. 2026 Annual Town Meeting will be held in the Wellesley High School auditorium (50 Rice Street) beginning on Monday, March 30 at 7 p.m. Town Meeting is expected to last for three weeks with meetings continuing on March 31, April 6 and 7, and April 13 and 14.

New! Annual Parking Permits Now Online

Do you regularly purchase a permit to park in Wellesley municipal lots? Starting December 15, annual parking permit applications and payments will now be [accepted online via the OpenGov portal](#). This is the same system used for all other Town of Wellesley online permits.



This new process will allow customers to apply for and purchase annual permits easily without having to rely on USPS or a trip to the Parking Clerk office at Town Hall. The registration(s) provided will be digitally recorded as "paid in full" for the year. Unlike in prior years, parking permit holders will not need to display anything in your vehicle.

Skip the Stuff Starts January 1, 2026

Get ready! Starting on January 1, 2026, the new Town bylaw known as [Skip the Stuff](#) takes effect. Under this new law, all food service establishments in Wellesley will provide single-use articles (eg. plastic utensils) and single-serving condiment packages ONLY by customer request or at a self-service counter.

Skip the Stuff was passed by 2025 Annual Town Meeting and is intended to: 1) Reduce the amount of waste generated by single-use articles; 2) Change customer habits; 3) Help reduce unnecessary costs to food service establishments. Single-use foodware is a huge and growing portion of the waste stream entering landfills and incinerators, and polluting city streets and waterways. This is a collaborative effort between the Health Department, Climate Action Committee, and the RDF.

Wellesley food service establishments are displaying Skip the Stuff signs and working to educate customers in the coming weeks. We appreciate their partnership communicating this new law. [Read more about Skip the Stuff in the Health Department webpages.](#)

E-bikes and E-scooters are fun to receive, but please know the LAWS to avoid criminal charges or fees.

Dirt bikes and motorcycles are not e-bikes in disguise. Shop smart, do your research, and you can save lives.

At speeds of 20 MPH and higher, you're on a motorized bike. You need a license, registration, and plate – not allowed for a tyke.

The news has been full of E-bike dangers of late. Please help all of us avoid this same fate.

Under 17? Helmets are a must. A message for parents, in whom we trust.

No E-bikes on sidewalks, NRC trails, dirt paths, and at Morses Pond. Keep e-bikes off Wellesley school and athletic fields, and public areas where people bond.

Most important of all, please keep your eyes peeled. When encountering pedestrians, riders always MUST yield!

No reckless operation, use common sense, and show respect. Ride safely and have fun, with all boxes checked.
