## Health Department COVID-19 Case Update.

Total confirmed cases in Massachusetts: 34,402 New Cases Today: 2,221

Total cases in Norfolk County: 3,499 Total cases in Wellesley: 84 (2 new)

The rise in our case counts is reflecting the current surge phase in the virus as COVID-19 continues to be extremely contagious. The Health Department is grateful to the community for continuing to adhere to the restrictions in place. The safety measures taken by all residents to stay home as much as possible, practice social distancing, and wear masks when outside is helping to flatten the curve and slow the spread of this disease.
