Wellesley Health Department COVID-19 Case Update.

Total confirmed cases in Massachusetts: 94,895 New Cases Today: 675

Total cases in Norfolk County: 7,919
Total cases in Wellesley: 210* (0 new)

*82 cases total in Wellesley long-term care facilities

Positive antibody tests: 3 new, 38 total

Positive antibody tests are reported separately and are not part of the total COVID-19 case count in Wellesley. Comprehensive information about the key public health indicators for reopening Massachusetts is updated daily on the Massachusetts Department of Public Health COVID-19 dashboard.

The State has enhanced its <u>weekly public health report for cities and towns</u> to include more local data on cases and testing, information on long term care facility cases and deaths, and nursing facility audit results. It is important to note that the COVID-19 case counts from the Health Department and the State are different due to cases reported in Wellesley where the infected individuals are not Wellesley residents.

Parks, Playing Fields and Tennis Courts Reopen for Limited Use.

Effective today, Wellesley parks, most playing fields, and public tennis courts reopened to the public



for limited use. Specific guidelines are in place and signs are posted in these areas. Key restrictions include: no groups larger than 10 people; no pick-up games; no contact sports; no practices; dogs must be leashed; and all trash must be carried out. For tennis courts, every other net is removed to encourage social distancing. Playgrounds at schools and parks remain closed; public basketball courts and the Wellesley High School track and field complex are also closed. Read the detailed guidelines for parks and fields.

When using parks and fields, please remember to maintain social distancing of at least six feet or wear a mask if this is not possible.

2020 Boston Marathon Cancelled.

The Boston Athletic Association (BAA) announced the 2020 Boston Marathon will be held as a virtual event; for the first time in history, the in-person running of the marathon is cancelled due to the ongoing Coronavirus pandemic.
