Free Electric Vehicle (EV) Test Drive and Owner Showcase on Sunday October 16

Make Your Next Car an EV, Save on Annual Fuel and Maintenance Costs, and Take Advantage of Federal Tax Credits and State Rebates

September 27, 2022 (Wellesley, MA) – Are you thinking about buying an electric vehicle (EV)? The Town of Wellesley’s Municipal Light Plant and Sustainable Wellesley announce a free event where you can test drive an EV and get answers to your EV or plug-in hybrid questions from local car owners.

Vehicle exhaust accounts for more than 34 percent of Wellesley’s greenhouse gas emissions (GHG). The Town of Wellesley, our state, and our country have set ambitious GHG emissions reduction goals. Driving an EV is one way you can help our community reach these goals.

The EV Showcase takes place on Sunday, October 16 from 2:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. in the parking lot of MassBay Community College at 50 Oakland Street in Wellesley. Rain date is Sunday October 23, 2:30 to 5:30 p.m. at the same location.

Test drives are available based on the order of [pre-registration](#). A valid driver’s license is required to test drive an EV.

Driving an EV can save you as much as \$1,000 every year on fuel costs—significant in the face of rising gas prices. EV owners can expect to save up to \$8,000 in maintenance costs over the life of their car because EVs don't require the regular oil changes and periodic tune-ups of a gas-powered, internal combustion engine car. In addition, the initial purchase cost for eligible EVs and hybrid vehicles can be offset by a [\\$7,500 federal tax credit](#) and [\\$2,500 Massachusetts state rebate](#).

The Wellesley Municipal Light Plant offers a [\\$96 annual electric bill credit](#) for EV owners who charge their vehicles during off-peak hours. To learn more, visit the [Wellesley Drives Electric](#) webpage.
